## NEW HAMPSHIRE – CLIMATE

New Hampshire experiences a [humid continental climate](#) ([Köppen climate classification](#) *Dfa* in some southern areas, *Dfb* in most of the state, and *Dfc* Subarctic in some northern highland areas), with warm, humid summers, and long, cold, and snowy winters. Precipitation is fairly evenly distributed all year. The climate of the southeastern portion is moderated by the [Atlantic Ocean](#) and averages relatively milder winters (for New Hampshire), while the northern and interior portions experience colder temperatures and lower humidity. Winters are cold and snowy throughout the state, and especially severe in the northern and mountainous areas. Average annual snowfall ranges from 60 inches (150 cm) to over 100 inches (250 cm) across the state.<sup>[25]</sup>

Average daytime highs are in the mid 70s°F to low 80s°F (around 24–28 °C) throughout the state in July, with overnight lows in the mid 50s°F to low 60s°F (13–15 °C). January temperatures range from an average high of 34 °F (1 °C) on the coast to overnight lows below 0 °F (–18 °C) in the far north and at high elevations. Average annual precipitation statewide is roughly 40 inches (100 cm) with some variation occurring in the [White Mountains](#) due to differences in elevation and annual snowfall. New Hampshire's highest recorded temperature was 106 °F (41 °C) in [Nashua](#) on July 4, 1911, while the lowest recorded temperature was –47 °F (–44 °C)

atop [Mount Washington](#) on January 29, 1934. Mount Washington also saw an unofficial  $-50^{\circ}\text{F}$  ( $-46^{\circ}\text{C}$ ) reading on January 22, 1885, which, if made official, would tie the all-time record low for New England (also  $-50^{\circ}\text{F}$  ( $-46^{\circ}\text{C}$ ) at [Big Black River](#), Maine, on January 16, 2009, and [Bloomfield, Vermont](#) on December 30, 1933).

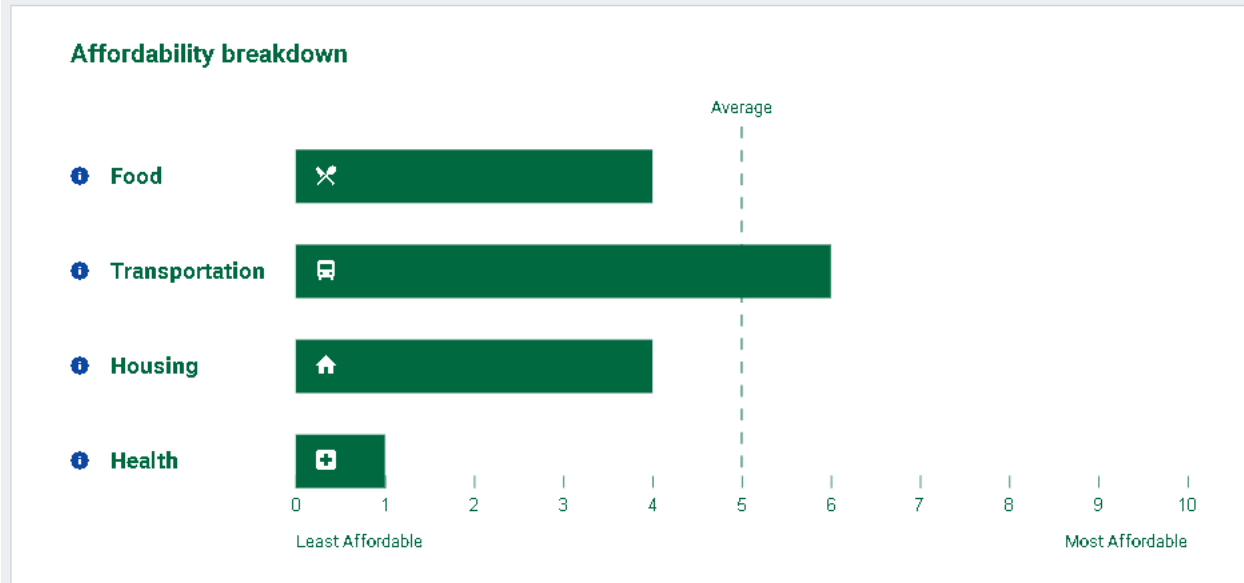
